#### **Shodan & Shodan Ho Examination Requirements**

#### Kata:

- 1. The examinee selects a kata from Group A
- 2. The examiner selects a kata from Heian to Tekki 1

#### **<u>Kihon</u>** - Do everything 4 times by the examiner's count

- **1.** Sanbon-Tzuki (Jodan-Chudan 1 one step, 3 punches)
- **2.** Age-Uke, Mayashi-Mae-Geri, Gyaku-Tzuki (stepping back)
- **3.** Soto-Uke, Empi-uchi, Uraken, Gyaku-Tzuki (Zenkutsu Dachi, Kiba Dachi, Zenkutsu Dachi)
- **4.** Shuto-Uke, Mayashi-Mae-Geri, Nukite (stepping back, Kokutsu Dachi)
- 5. Uchi-Uke, Mayashi-Mae-Geri, Kizami-Tzuki, Gyaku-Tzuki
- **6.** Mae-Geri (Chudan-Jodan, 1 count 2 steps)
- 7. Mawashi-Geri (Chudan-Jodan, 1 count 2 steps)
- **8.** Yoko-Geri-Keage (Kiba Dachi)
- **9.** Yoko-Geri-Kekomi (Kiba Dachi)
- 10. Mayashi Yoko-Kekomi, then step forward Mawashi-Geri, Gyaku-Tzuki
- 11. Mayashi Mawashi-Geri, Oi-Tzuki (Jodan)
- **12.** In Zenkutsu Dachi, perform Mae-Geri, Yoko-Geri-Kekomi then back to Zenkutsu Dachi (stationary, 4 times each leg)

## **Kumite:**

Jiu-kumite (against a brown belt, a Shodan, and a Nidan)

#### Nidan & Nidan Ho Examination Requirements

#### Kata

- 1. The examinee selects a kata from Group A, B, or C
- **2.** The examiner must select a kata from Group A or B plus one kata from Heian 2-5 or Tekki Shodan

## **<u>Kihon</u>** - Do everything 4 times by the examiner's count

- 1. In Jiu-Dachi, Kizami-Tzuki, Oi-Tzuki, Oi-Tzuki (Jodan)
- 2. In Jiu-Dachi, Kizami-Tzuki, then stepping 2 times Mae-Geri, Oi-Tzuki
- 3. In Kiba Dachi, stepping to side Yoko-Geri-Keage, turn 180 degrees and execute Yoko-Geri-Kekomi (with back leg).
  - 4. In Jiu-Dachi, stepping back Age-Uke then step forward Mawashi-Geri, Uraken, Oi-Tzuki (Jodan)
- 5. In Zenkutsu Dachi, perform Mae-Geri, Yoko-Geri Keage, Ushiro-Geri, then back to Zenkutsu Dachi (stationary 4 times each leg)

## **Kumite:**

- 1. Jiu Kumite
- 2. Offensive and Defensive techniques against different opponents.

## **Sandan Examination Requirements**

## Kata:

- 1. The examinee selects a kata from Group A, B, or C
- **2.** The examiner selects a kata from Group A or B plus one kata from Heian 2-5 or Tekki Shodan

## Kihon:

- **1.** The examinee explains a combination technique power development concept.
- **2.** Explain from beginning to end the important points of the techniques.
- **3.** Explain to a student from beginning to end how the techniques should be performed correctly.

## **Kumite**

- 1. Jiu-kumite against a Shodan
- **2.** Jiu-kumite against a stronger opponent

## **Yondan Examination Requirements**

# Kata:

- 1. The examinee selects a kata from Group A, B, or C
- 2. The examiner selects a kata from Group A, B, or C

#### Kihon:

- 1. The examinee explains a selected combination technique's important points.
- 2. The examinee explains the important points in the performance of the selected combination techniques.

#### **Kumite:**

- 1. Jiu-ippon-kumite
- 2. Jiu-kumite
- **3.** Explain the correct timing from offensive as well defensive point of view while doing jiu-kumite.

## **Technical Research**

- **1.** Select a technical subject and teach it to a group of students.
- 2. Turn in a technical paper no less the 500 words on a special subject, and explain the content of the paper.

## **Godan Examination Requirements**

## Kata:

- 1. Examinee selects a kata from Group A, B, or C
- 2. Examiner selects a kata from Group A, B, or C (Kata must be different in principle than the kata selected by the examinee, such as shorin versus shorei)
- **3.** Research on some special area should be completed. The examinee will be able to explain, demonstrate, as well as instruct the prepared subject. The subject must be physiological.

## **Rokudan Examination Requirements**

- 1. Research on some special area should be completed. The examinee will be able to explain, demonstrate, as well as instruct the prepared subject. The subject can be psychological or physiological.
- **2.** Examinee selects a kata from Group A, B, or C
- **3.** Examiner selects a kata from Group A, B, or C (Kata must be different in principle than the kata selected by the examinee, such as shorin versus shorei)
